~Planning Your Summer~

I'm sure you've heard this old joke. A preacher was asked, "How has worship attendance been during the summer?" "Up and down," the preacher replied, "up in the mountains and down on the beach." I know, it's well-worn and corny; but it's a good intro for me to say something about summer worship and ministry at Wesley Memorial.

Summertime is upon us and many of us will be gone for some or all of the summer months. I THINK THIS IS GREAT! It is important that we have some time for rest, recreation, and renewal. The Bible tells us that the Creator God took a Sabbath – a day of rest – and that occasionally Jesus withdrew from his work and responsibilities. We all need some time off and away.

HOWEVER, I hope that this summer we won't get so caught up in our "R n' R" that we forget about the church back here at home – Wesley Memorial – and take a vacation from our worship and witness. Our spirits need rest and renewal just as do our bodies and I know of no better place to find that spiritual re-creation than in the worship and fellowship here at Wesley Memorial.

- 5. Remember, Wesley Memorial's ministry is fulltime (that's means all summer) and it needs your support (your financial support but also your presence and participation!)

In July, Miriam and I will celebrate our "first anniversary" in ministry with you. We are thankful for the opportunity to be in ministry with you. We are going to look forward to seeing you this Sunday and throughout the summer.



Generous Giving Keeps Operating Budget in the 'Black'

We continue to be overwhelmed by the support of Wesley Memorial's members and friends. Your payments on pledge for the operating budget this year have already totaled \$668,501. We are currently \$37,330 ahead of our year to date projections for pledge income. Our expenses have been kept well below budget in this same period and have been limited to just \$678,900. We are current on all bills. When all forms of operating budget income are considered, we are nearly \$100,000 ahead as we enter the summer. This is a good place to be before summer begins.

As you know, the summer can get awfully lean as our members and friends travel and are away from Wesley Memorial. Gifts to the operating budget often go on vacation and don't get caught up until fall! It is not unusual for us to have a negative cash flow by the time September rolls around.
