#### Our Church History...

During World War II, the Associate Board of Stewards of Wesley Memorial Methodist Church sent regular newsletters to our church members serving in the Armed Forces around the world. We have more than 60 letters that the church received in response to this news from home, the Testaments that went to each service person and even fruitcake!

The letters and newsletters have been professionally preserved and catalogued through the generosity of the children of Robert T. Amos, Jr., and the United Methodist Men, with assistance from the High Point Museum. They will be presented to the congregation at the 11:00 service on November 10 and can be seen in the Narthex following that service. Copies will be shared with the High Point Museum and the High Point Library. After November 10 the material can be read in front of the display case between the Adult Sunday School wing and the Historical Room.

The display case holds an original issue of that newsletter, "Pillar to Post;" a letter written by William H. Davis, Jr. (uncle of Phyllis Pugh), who was killed in that conflict; a V (for Victory) Mail sent by Bob Amos, Jr; actual Testaments sent to service people; a plaque listing those who were killed; and various military insignia and service souvenirs.

#### **Financial Update**

Your generous gifts through the first nine months of 2013 have enabled us to maintain a positive cash flow, remain current on all bills, and invest in important ministries at Wesley Memorial, in High Point and beyond. Thank you!

Net Income	-\$110,955	\$62,422	\$38,686

At this same point in 2011, we had received \$110,955 less than we needed to operate. In the 2012 and 2013, your consistent regular giving has enabled us to avoid using our credit line or cash reserves.

We have received \$38,686 more than we have expended so far this year. AND...we have paid 80% of our apportionments to the Conference and District.

We are in this position for three reasons: careful management of our budget by staff and ministry team leaders, consistent payment of pledges by our members, and generous gifts from members and friends who support Wesley Memorial but do not pledge.

Thank you for your continued support as we enter this busy and exciting time of ministry. Your consistent support and fulfillment of your commitments will enable us to make a strong finish to 2013.
