

JOURNEY GROUPS

Wesley Memorial's *New Initiative* for Personal and Community Transformation



We all know the power of small groups. Jesus had a small group; He called them disciples. John Wesley had one, too; he called it his “holy club.” Perhaps you’re in a small group yourself—whether a Unity Group, a Sunday School class, or some other kind of group, club, or circle that gets together regularly to grow together.

Lately, our Adult Spiritual Formation Team has been discerning God’s call in the life of WMUMC to offer a network of small groups that is focused on building relationships in order to promote transformation. We have noted how excellently our church provides *educational* small groups (for example, Sunday School, where you might hear from speakers each week, and Unity Groups, where the group reads a spiritual book together). This is wonderful.

We want to supplement those primarily educational opportunities with groups that are focused on *relationships* and *transformation*—instead of education.

This is where Journey Groups come in.

Journey Groups, launching later this month (January 21, to be exact), are gatherings of 3-8 people that regularly spend around 90 minutes together off the church campus *sharing life together*. They **connect** through sharing the struggles and triumphs of their week, **reflect** on the most recent Scripture and sermon proclaimed at WMUMC, and **effect** meaningful change for the transformation of their lives and their world.

We named them Journey Groups in order to reflect our belief that the spiritual life is a journey, and, as the old saying goes, a journey undertaken alone may go faster, but a journey undertaken together goes further.


The *most* amazing thing about Journey Groups, however, is how easy they are. There is no one who has to be a leader—no one “teaches” or regularly has to come up with material. And there are virtually no rules for how to start, run, or end a group. We offer plenty of suggestions (see the Journey Group Start-Up Guides available around the church, or see the website at wesleymemorial.org/journey), but it’s really up to you.

The only real goal of a Journey Group is to be focused on building deep and strong relationships with one another and engaging in Christian reflection on your lives and your experiences with God. This is how real *transformation* occurs, for yourself, your group, our church, and our world!

More information on Journey Groups is forthcoming; in the meantime, check out wesleymemorial.org/journey, and be prayerfully considering two or three friends God may be calling you to pursue a deeper spiritual relationship with through a Journey Group.

During the process of discerning God's call for our new Journey Groups initiative, the Adult Spiritual Formation team decided to “beta test” the Journey Group meeting—that is, to test it out and make sure all our ducks were in a row. Boy, have we had fun!

One of the most exciting things about Journey Groups is that they are encouraged to meet *off* the church campus—either in a member's home, a coffee shop, wherever. This was good for us, since our raucous laughter has occasionally gotten us in trouble with other groups meeting down the hall from us at church!

Between laughs, though, we have shared intimately with one another. “Companionship” is a good word to describe the relationships we've built together. Each meeting, we chose to begin by asking each member, “How is it with your soul?” This is an old question that the founder of Methodism, John Wesley, loved to ask of himself, his friends, and his pastors. We reflected on our lives, our families, and our spirituality. The disparate ages and stages of life in our group, which you might expect would make it hard for us to relate to one another, instead created rich and

insightful connections and conversations. We understand one another so much better now, and have created, as the old hymn says, ties that bind!

We've also noticed how much better attention we pay during the sermons on weeks we know we'll be meeting with our Journey Group. Some of us even take notes now! It's neat to see how being in a Journey Group has enriched our worship life, too.

All in all, we can't say enough about Journey Groups and can't wait to roll them out later this month! Journey Groups are a great way to connect and grow in faith with others who are on this same spiritual journey.

From Our Pastor

“A Testimonial About The Power Of A Small Group”



I preached my first sermon on the First Sunday of Advent in 1980 when I was nineteen years old. So, I've been committed to serving the Lord through the local church for a long time. It has been a long journey for me and my family.

What has kept me consistently committed to the spiritual journey over the last 37 years? Many things, but one of the most important means of grace that has motivated me and sustained me over the years has been my commitment to staying in a small group where I experience close Christian fellowship and gracious accountability. My on-going experiences with my various small groups over the years have kept me growing in my faith and my dedication to Christ. My small groups have kept me focused on a pursuit of life in the Spirit which has enabled me to live a more balanced, holistic life. Whenever I have moved, one of the first things I did was to connect with a small group that would help me continue my transformation in Christ.

We are all very busy. It has not always been easy to make time for my small group meetings, but I have made that a priority. We make time for those things that we deem important. Being a husband and father, pastoring churches, pursuing extra graduate degrees, have all provided me with a very busy life. But through it all, I've stayed connected with a small group. There have been times when my small group met so early in the morning that nothing (but sleep!) could compete. My commitment to a small group has blessed both my biological family and my church family. The present group with whom I meet has been gathering for over a decade. These eight people have been a tremendous blessing to my life and I trust that I have been the same to them.

Over the years I have seen many people wax hot and grow cold with their spiritual lives. For me, participation in a small group helps me evaluate my life and prays with me and for me is central to my pursuit of God. It helps me to “go on to perfection” to use old Methodist language.

Over the next few months, you will be invited to join or create a small group where mutual accountability and prayer will occur. We are go-


ing to call them **Journey Groups**. Hopefully, these groups will be more about transformation than information. But, if you are already in such a group (a Unity Group, an Emmaus reunion group, a choir, a circle or a Sunday School) that is great. I hope that you will re-evaluate your group and make sure that it is a means of grace in your life, a place where mutual accountability and prayer is happening, a place that doesn't just inform you but transforms you. Jesus (and John Wesley) were strong proponents of spiritual growth through small groups, so I hope that we will heed their wisdom.







Bible Explorers


Sunday afternoon programs for
