Sanctuary Counseling Group (SCG), formerly known as Methodist Counseling and Consultation Services,

has provided mental health counseling and pastoral counseling in the greater Charlotte area and in satellite offices in cities and towns around the western piedmont of North Carolina **for over 50 years.** They are accredited by the American Association of Pastoral Counselors and the Samaritan Institute. **SCG** is dedicated to the healing of heart, mind, and soul, by providing excellent emotional, spiritual, and relational health care to all people. While **SCG** has a standard fee for services comparable to fees charged by other agencies in our area, in compliance with the Samaritan Institute and the American Association of Pastoral Counselors guideline SCG can use a fee-adjusted sliding scale based on household income and family size when necessary. Fees for counseling are negotiated between the client and the therapist. Insurance coverage is often available and is determined on a case-by-case basis. Clients who lack insurance coverage or who have insufficient financial resources to afford the "going rate" for counseling services may inquire about the SCG Samaritan Client Assistance Fund.


